I would like to end this with a quote that I feel fits for this time...

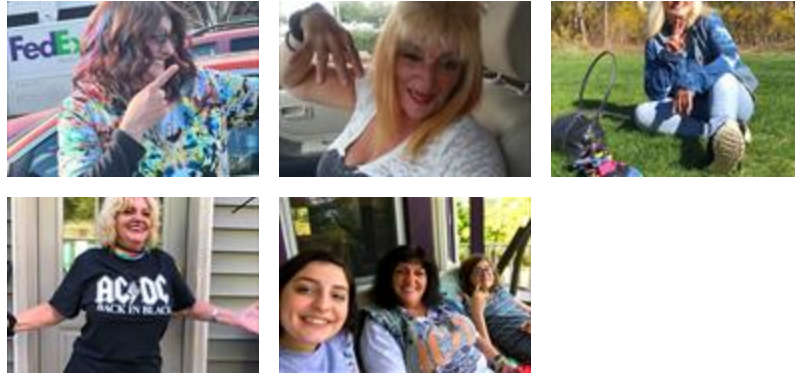
