Lonja Stremouchow (69), known as Lonnie to friends and family, passed away on 3/28/2026 peacefully at home after battling stage 4 cancer. 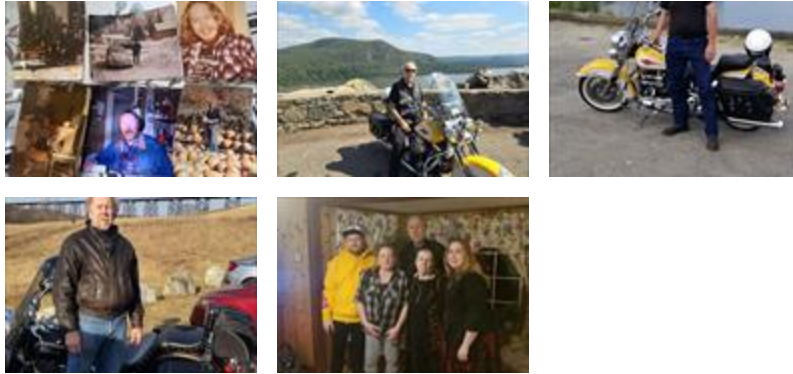

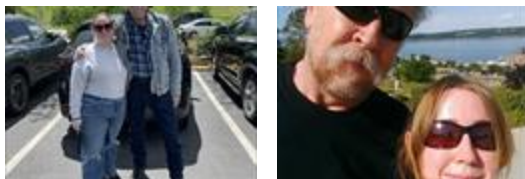
