



## Marc Robert Fitzsimmons

Marc Robert Fitzsimmons, 63, died on August 23, 2022, as a result of a car accident in upstate NY. He was a resident of Colonial Beach, VA since 2014. Marc was born in Canada to Thomas Eric Fitzsimmons and Elizabeth A Fitzsimmons who moved there from England. The family moved to CT, and there, Marc was the first of his family to become a naturalized citizen of the US. At that point, Marc went on to serve his new country in the US Navy and was stationed on the USS Eisenhower. After his time in the Navy, he attended Ithaca College in NY as a photo journal major. Marc made many lifelong friends from his time with the Ithaca College Rowing Crew. He worked for the Hartford Business Journal and had the opportunity to photograph many famous people. Marc moved to and enjoyed many different states; MA, LA, MS, MD, NC and VA where he learned and excelled at Information Technology. He loved his work in the IT departments of multiple government offices. When at home, you could hear old time jazz playing on his stereo or find him at The Dockside Restaurant & Tiki Bar eating a favorite dish or listening to a local band. He had planned and was looking forward to a 2 year “trip around the Americas” learning new cultures and photographing the experience.

Marc was happiest when spending time with his children, Geoffrey and Ethan, traveling to places that had abandoned buildings, and being behind his camera. Marc was extremely passionate and incredibly talented with his photography. Marc was also a very talented writer. He had the heart of an

artist.

Marc is survived by his former wife, Tracey Migeot, mother of his sons, Geoffrey Fitzsimmons and Ethan Fitzsimmons; his sister, Belinda Bullock, her husband Gary, and their children Maddie and Derek; and his brother, James Fitzsimmons.

Marc leaves us with many cherished memories, and he will be greatly missed by family and friends.
